

# WYCC Boater's Guidelines

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1. Immediately report any unsafe waterfront/slip conditions such as faulty or missing pier-planks, boards, supports, etc... to the Club Management or Boating Committee.
2. Slip holders must keep their respective areas in a neat and orderly fashion - this includes the disposal of their own trash. There are no club employees available to do this for you.
3. Any individual slip modification/improvements (including electrical) must be approved by the boating committee and be funded by the slip holder unless that expense is specifically approved by the Board of Directors.
4. Slip holders must carefully select where they mount individual dock boxes so as not to impede the flow of traffic along the walk-way or interfere with neighboring boat tie-down lines.
5. Assigned slip holder's rent is due each month even if their boat is temporarily moved to another location.
6. Slip rental and electrical bills are not prorated - they are billed on a monthly basis.
7. The boating committee must review and approve slip changes (moving to a different slip) prior to such move taking place.
8. When using the boat ramp, your trailer must not be left anywhere within the roadway. It is not intended for any trailer to be parked overnight without specific authorization from the boating committee.
9. Non-slip owners must not launch their boats and then simply use a vacant slip for overnight docking (this includes the jet ski docking pad) - this is unfair to those members who actually pay for their slip rentals and also can interfere with prearranged transient or visiting boater's slip assignments.

10. Once the waterfront and shed water pipes have been turned off for the winter, boat owners must never turn them back on - historically, this has resulted in the freezing and subsequent "bursting" of the water pipes.

11. In addition to the above, all WYCC boaters are requested to:

(a) Respond to calls for help from fellow club members who may be out on the water and in need of assistance.

(b) Maintain the Boater's Calling Tree so you can participate in the notification or warnings of extreme weather, storm surges, higher or lower than normal tides or, simply to call a neighboring boat owner if something is amiss on their boat.

(c) Bring to the attention of the boating committee any upcoming social or educational activities that you feel may be of interest to your fellow boaters.
