BASIC GUIDELINES

The sailing program is designed to teach respect for people, property and the water around us. The following guidelines support the goals of the program and all Jr. Sailing students are expected to follow them. In the unlikely case a junior sailor is asked to leave the program because of a problem with conduct or with unsafe behavior, that sailor's tuition will be forfeited.

1. Each sailor will be required to pass a (50 meter) swimming test.
2. A **Vest-type life jacket** must be provided by the sailor and worn at all times when on the water and/or piers. Vest-type jackets with cloth type covering are available at many department stores and all boating stores. **Yoke-type life jackets are not acceptable.**
3. Classes are held MONDAY through THURSDAY. Sailors are expected to stay each day for the complete session.
4. Class sessions run from 9:00 am through 12:00pm and from 1:00 pm till 4:00.
5. Skippers and Racing skippers are expected to stay all day
6. Mates, Skippers and Racing Skippers are expected to participate in Friday races from 9:00 – 12:00
7. Tuition is not refunded, or prorated for days missed, or planned absences for vacation, etc.
8. Sailors will NOT leave the area of their class without a written permission slip from a parent.
9. Sailors are expected to assist in rigging and de-rigging boats every day.
10. Sailors will be expected to assist in the repair of damage occurred on a boat they have been sailing.
11. Smoking or the use of alcohol or controlled substances is not permitted.
12. iPods, MP3 players, TVs or similar devices are not appropriate for sailing classes.
13. Cell phones are not to be used during classes, except for emergency use.
14. Loss or damage to personal property is at the owner's risk.
15. Dangerous, discourteous or unruly conduct is prohibited.
16. Guests are not permitted.
