

Warwick Yacht & Country Club
House and Ground Rules

1. Welcome to the Warwick Yacht and Country Club. To assist the management in making time spent at WYCC enjoyable, we ask the cooperation of our members, guests and resident and transient boaters to see that courtesies are extended to each other and the rules and regulations of the Club are followed by all.
2. The use of the facilities of the clubhouse shall be available to members in good standing and their guests subject to the rules contained herein. The clubhouse shall not be used for gatherings of a public nature or for subscription parties by any member or organization without the express approval of the Board of Directors or through the Club Manager.
3. Complaints dealing with service or management shall be made to the Club Manager who will in turn, advise the Board at its next regular meeting and as to the corrective actions taken, if any.
4. Animals ARE NOT permitted on the grounds of WYCC. There are two exceptions: Seeing-Eye dog with its owner and pets of visiting yachtsmen, which will be leashed. Owners of animals are required to clean up after their pets and deposit refuse in dumpster or trash cans provided.
5. Members may be asked to show their membership card at any time by the Management or any member of the Board of Directors.
6. Visitors from recognized yacht clubs must show a current membership card for reciprocal privileges.
7. Members, guests, and visitors will be accountable at all times for their conduct and that of their families and guests as well as for payment of all charges incurred by same and with the responsibility of informing such guests of Club regulations. If at any time, the conduct of any one is considered to be unbecoming or offensive to others, the offender will be requested by the Club Manager, officer of the Board, or member of the Board of Directors to leave WYCC property immediately. The decision on whether conduct is unbecoming or offensive will rest entirely with the Club Manager or officers present.
8. All clubhouse property shall be treated with care at all times. Books, magazines, glassware, and furniture shall not be removed from the clubhouse without the consent of the management.
9. Gambling in any form involving the exchange of monies through cards, dice or other devices is strictly prohibited..
10. House telephones may be used for local calls only.
11. The Club will be closed on Mondays except when a holiday falls on Monday, then the Club will be closed on Tuesday.
12. Members are entitled to bring guests subject to the rules contained herein. Children of members, under the age of eighteen (18), may have guests only when accompanied by a parent, except for the pool and tennis courts.
13. Members or children of members utilizing this privilege shall be responsible for the conduct of such guests and charges incurred by such guests.
14. Members will be responsible for the conduct of their children, in consideration for the other members and their guests.
15. Members' children who are under twenty-one (21) years old may not sit at the bar.
16. Resident guests may be entertained by members, not to exceed six (6) times in any one calendar year.
17. Members shall register invited guests in the Guest Register provided for this purpose and maintained by the Club Manager.

18. Guests of Club members enter the Club property and participate in activities at their own risk.
19. Members, guests, and visitors are responsible for keeping the house and grounds clean to the extent of cleaning up their own debris such as papers, cans, etc. Refuse will be put in containers provided for this purpose. Docks must be kept clean of refuse at all times.
20. Bicycles, mopeds, motorized scooters and golf carts shall not be ridden anywhere on the property. Special consideration by the Club Manager, will be given to those riders who use these vehicles as transportation to swim practice, sailing lessons, use of the pool, etc.
21. Any person, member or non-member, who has been denied the use of Club facilities, whether for a limited period or permanently, shall not be entitled to use such facilities as a "guest" of a member.
22. No outside food or beverages may be brought into the clubhouse for consumption by the members or staff, unless previously approved by the Club Manager. Covered dish parties and other special functions previously approved by the Club Manager shall be the only exception.
23. People who have resigned or who have been expelled for membership and others not in good standing with unpaid indebtedness to the Club shall not be entitled to use Club facilities as a "guest" of a member.
24. It is recommended that members inquire with the Club Manager as to such persons who are not entitled to guest privileges to avoid embarrassment to all concerned.
25. Persons from visiting yacht clubs, which clubs extend reciprocal privileges to members of our Club, shall be entitled, upon proper registration with the Club Manager, to the use of the Club facilities.
26. Excluded from all evening functions in the dining room are persons dressed in short shorts and play suit, swimwear or working clothes not designed or intended for normal business/social wear. For regular or special evening meals, generally acceptable business or sport dress is acceptable.
27. All charges for dining room service shall be by charge ticket signed by a member or paid by credit card or check. If a member does not sign his/her charge ticket, an automatic 20 percent gratuity will be added.
28. No bather will be allowed in the clubhouse or hallways with bare feet or exposed bathing suits for any purpose. People wearing bathing suits suitably covered with beach coat, shirt or other cover-up and acceptable foot protection will be permitted in the Club when swimming pool is normally open.
29. Social Committee, with approval of the Commodore, may specify other attire for specific occasions.
30. The snack bar is available to members during the normal hours of operation of the swimming pool, regardless of dress, and is for the purpose of allowing people who have used the pool, especially children and young people, to obtain food and drink (non-alcoholic). Adults are requested not to consume beer or other alcoholic beverages in this area.
31. Liquor lockers are located in the telephone foyer of the clubhouse for the storage of spirits by members.
32. A request shall be made of the Club Manager for assignment of a liquor locker and the issuance of a key if one is available.
33. All members leasing liquor lockers shall keep them locked at all times and no person shall enter the locker of another person without his express permission.
34. Only people authorized to tend bar are permitted behind the bar.
35. Unless otherwise limited by notice posted on the bulletin board or appearing in the newsletter, guests may be invited to Club functions.

36. No member shall instruct, demand or order any employee of the Club to do personal chores or special favors not otherwise within the scope of the employment of such employee.
37. No member or guests of any member shall play cards, dance or engage in similar recreational pursuits with employees. Members are permitted to play tennis with off-duty employees to whom tennis court privileges have been extended.
38. All complaints concerning performance of duties of any employee shall be made to the Club Manager or, in the absence of the Club Manager, to an officer of the Club or member of the Board of Directors, or a committee chairman or representative of the committee in charge of a particular function, which they deem necessary.
39. In the absence of the Club Manager or club officer or a member of the Board of Directors, the bartender in charge at a given time is authorized to intercede in any disturbances or altercations and to direct offending people to leave the premises until the matter involved can be brought to the attention of the Club Manager. In such case the employee shall promptly notify the Club Manager and explain the circumstances involved and action taken.
40. The clubhouse and all operations thereof shall be conducted in full compliance with current A.B.C. regulations and any rule in contravention of such regulations is hereby declared void.
41. In accordance with A.B.C. Board Regulations, no persons under the age of twenty-one (21) years may partake of alcoholic beverages in any form or at any time on the Club property.
42. Members shall not permit persons under the age of twenty-one (21) years to partake of alcoholic beverages in any form upon Club property.
43. Members having or transporting liquor to the Club shall have their names and account number prominently placed on their bottles.
44. No member or guest shall use the bottle or direct use of any bottle belonging to another person unless such person is physically present and approve of such use.
45. All private parties and functions must be sponsored by a member and at least one member of the Club shall be in attendance at all times.
46. Committee chairmen should present to the Board, as early during the fiscal year as possible, their request for reservations either by letter or by use of regular application forms for reserved dates.
47. All youth activities including teen dances, swim parties, and similar events shall be properly chaperoned and it is recommended that there be one member to not more than twenty (20) persons.
